PRE-ARRIVAL NOTIFICATION OF SECURITY (PANS) FOR VESSEL CALLING ADANI VIZHINJAM PORT PRIVATE LIMITED (AVPPL)/(VIZHINJAM INTERNATIONAL SEAPORT)

Dear Sir,

All ships intending to visit Adani Vizhinjam Port Private Limited (Vizhinjam International Seaport) are required to provide their Pre-Arrival Notification of Security (PANS) information as per ISPS code, prior to 96 hours to the Port Authorities and Security Agencies listed below.

If the voyage of a vessel is less than 96 Hours then the PANS must be sent within 2 hours from the departure of the last port (LPC).

Master of the vessel / steamer Agent shall ensure that PANS as prescribed by IMO including the last ten ports of call is submitted to Port and other specified authorities (Customs, APHO, etc.) and Immigration well in time i.e. prior to 96 hrs. of Arrival (or as prescribed for shorter duration schedule). The master of the vessel authorized steamer agent shall submit a request to the FRRO / Civil authority at same time along with IMO crew list. List of authorities to whom the PANS are mandatorily to be sent is as tabulated below:-

The security agencies shall give the necessary clearance for the safe arrival of crafts or vessels, if not in cognizance with the information provided must intimate the AVPPL or other Ports promptly.

The steamer agents of the vessel must coordinate with all the security agencies to facilitate the Port formalities.

The vessel which does not have any program for entry into AVPPL facility but awaiting for orders and are utilizing the UNCLOS "right of innocent passage" must wait outside the port limits of AVPPL or even outside the territorial waters.

On dropping the anchor or on arriving at the above mentioned location, vessel masters are obliged to inform the position and time of anchoring to AVPPL on VHF Channel 10/16 and maintain a continuous listening watch.

All vessels must have the AIS continuously "ON", all throughout their passage within the Indian Territorial waters and if AIS is inoperative or switched "OFF" for any other reasons then it will be a non-compliance which is to be intimated to the flag state and coastal state authority (DG Shipping) without fail.

You are directed to adhere to all mentioned above and failing which the vessel's Entry into the Port Facilities may be denied as per the provisions under regulation XI -2/9.2 of SOLAS and the ISPS code.

Subject: Procedure & Requirements for Pre-Arrival Notification of Security (PANS) to Enter the Indian Port Facilities-reg.

Whereas, the Government of India has ratified the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, 1974 (SOLAS), and the Convention entered into force on 25th May 1980 through accession. The International Ship and Port Facility Security Code (ISPS Code), was established under Chapter XI-2 of the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS) 1974 w.e.f. 01st July 2004. The ISPS Code sets forth a mandatory security framework for international shipping, providing comprehensive maritime and port security requirements.

- Whereas, under SOLAS Regulation XI-2/9.2, a contracting government may require that ships intending to enter its port, furnish the specific information provided under Regulation XI-2/9.2.1 to officers duly authorised by that government to ensure compliance prior to their entry into the port facility. Compliance with this regulation is mandatory.
- 3. This Directorate has issued various circulars from time to time, to provide guidance to vessels entering Indian port facilities in line with the requirements specified under ISPS Code and specifically the Pre-Arrival Notification of Security (PANS). Accordingly, the PANS reporting for respective vessels is in format prescribed in these circulars.
- 4. However, there was a need felt to consolidate the existing circulars and revise the requirements in line with the Government policy towards ease of doing business. This circular is being accordingly issued to consolidate all previous circulars including but not limited to NT/ISPS/13/2005 dated 21 November 2005; NT/ISPS/SHIP/02/2009 dated 02 February 2009;

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NT/ISPS/SHIP/02/2011 dated 15 November 2011; NT/ISPS/CIRCULAR No. 01/2011 dated 28 September 2011; NT/ISPS/CIRCULAR No. 01/2020 dated 05 February 2020 issued providing "Guidelines to vessels for entry into Indian Port Facilities - ISPS Compliance related issues".

- 5. It may be noted that the Merchant Shipping (Ships and Port Facility Security) Rules, 2024 have been notified, requiring ships, ports, and companies to comply with the requirement prescribed in the notified Rules. Section 29 of the MS (ISPS) Rules makes it a mandatory obligation for any ship entering a port within the jurisdiction of India to provide information ninety-six hours prior to its arrival.
- The reporting requirement of PANS apply to the following vessels on international voyages entering Indian waters, vessels trading in coastal waters or coasting between Indian Ports:
 - Passenger ships, including high-speed passenger crafts;
 - b. Cargo ships, including high-speed craft of 500 GT and above;
 - c. Mobile offshore drilling units; and
 - d. Pleasure Yachts
 - e. Sailing Vessel
- 7. The Vessels as specified under para 5 or their Ship Master / Ship Owners / Managers / Operators / Ship Agents are required to submit the information contained as per Annexure I (for passenger ships, cargo ships & mobile offshore drilling units) and Annexure II (for yachts) with immediate effect to the relevant regional authorities specified in Table 1 as well as Port Facility Security Officer of the ships port of call.

8. General Requirements for submission of PANS:

- a. The PANS should be submitted to the concerned port and the relevant regional authority specified under Table 1 at least 96 hours prior to the arrival of the vessel at any Port in India.
- b. If the voyage of the vessel is shorter than 96 hours, the PANS may be submitted within 2 hours of departure from the last port.
- c. Information regarding armed guards onboard the vessel when calling Indian Ports or transiting through the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) is also required to be forwarded to the Indian Navy, Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre (MRCC), Mumbai and the local Customs Authority (through the vessel's agent at the concerned port).
- d. All Indian Ports are advised to take appropriate measures to ensure that only ships in possession of the relevant ISPS documentation as applicable are permitted to enter the port facility.
- e. Vessels without appropriate documentation would be permitted to berth only under special circumstances, with prior approval of the Port Facility Security Officer (PFSO). However, such cases should be immediately brought to the notice of the nearest Mercantile Marine Department and the Directorate General of Shipping by the PFSO explaining the circumstances under which the vessel was permitted to enter the port facility limits without PANS reporting.
- 9. The online reporting of PANS in the NLP Sagar Sethu Portal is under development. Once the PANS is fully developed and implemented online, it needs to be submitted online. A Notice for the implementation of PANS will be issued by the Directorate Subsequently.

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- 10. This MS Notice supersede all previous circulars on PANS, including but not limited to NT/ISPS/13/2005 dated 21 November 2005; NT/ISPS/SHIP/02/2009 dated 02 February 2009; NT/ISPS/SHIP/02/2011 dated 15 November 2011; NT/ISPS/CIRCULAR No. 01/2011 dated 28 September 2011; NT/ISPS/CIRCULAR No. 01/2020 dated 05 February 2020 issued providing "Guidelines to vessels for entry into Indian Port Facilities ISPS Compliance related issues".
- This MS Notice is issued with the approval of the Director General of Shipping and shall come into force with immediate effect.
